Our RDAC Seal Candidates outperformed the rest of the nation having an 80% success rate at BUD/s while the average rate is 25%.


Please join us in these events and show your support for our ship and our Sea Cadets.


Other Adopted Ship News

USS Connecticut (SSN 22)

The Navy announced earlier in July that our adopted nuclear attack submarine USS Connecticut (SSN 22), heavily damaged in a collision with a sea mount in the South China Sea, is now expected to return to operational service in late 2026; a delay of about a year from prior news

Long shipyard periods are challenging and we send our best wishes to the commanding officer, Commander Andrew Ra, and to his officers and crew.



USS Winston S. Churchill (DDG 81)

Our adopted destroyer, USS Winston S. Churchill, departed her homeport of Mayport, Florida, on June 21st, to join the USS Gerald R. Ford (CVN 78) task force for a multi-month deployment. The ship hosted families onboard for breakfast and farewells before getting underway.

The ship had a stop in Rota Spain on July 18-19, and passed east-bound through the Strait of Gibraltar on July 21st.

Our Council "adopted" this Arleigh Burke class guided missile destroyer, following a port visit to Stamford, CT in August 2003. Since then, the ship has earned many operational excellence awards. We wish the CO, Captain Patrick O'Loughlin, and his officers and crew, a successful and safe deployment overseas in our defense.

The local volunteer Navy SEAL Recruiting District Assistance Council (RDAC) candidate mentoring program, led by Council Board member and retired Navy Captain Drew Bisset, continues to maintain its training momentum, preparing these impressive local area young men for the arduous SEAL screening and training to come.

In one recent event, held July 19th, four of the Candidates competed against approximately 100 swimmers in the Greenwich One Mile Swim, hosted by the Greenwich YMCA. In a very competitive field including endurance racers, Candidate Liam Bogart finished second overall.

All four swimmers completed the one mile at a pace that demonstrates their ability to pass the Basic Underwater Demolition/SEAL (BUD/S) screening two mile open ocean swim that is one requirement of becoming a SEAL.


Help Recruit New League Members

Commander Cerone, a native of Annapolis, is a 2008 graduate of the Naval Academy. Before joining USS Hartford (SSN 768) as commanding officer in May 2025, he held positions of increasing responsibility including: chief engineer on USS West Virginia (Gold SSBN 736); executive officer on USS Helena (SSN 725); and undersea/carrier programming officer in the office of the Chief of Naval Operations in Washington DC, supporting all submarine and carrier procurement programs.

In addition to his Bachelor of Science degree in applied math from the Naval Academy, he holds a masters degree in Business Administration from the University of Virginia.

We expect Commander Cerone to make a highly informative and topical presentation concerning our vital submarine service, with a question and answer period.
