Finneran Scholarships Awarded

Parents, veterans, Council members, friends, and undergraduate Dealey Division Cadets and their officers gathered on June 9th to wish "fair winds and following seas" to two graduating Sea Cadet high school seniors, and to participate in the annual change of the watch ceremony.

He also continues his Naval service as a reservist as the Deputy Director, Operations at U.S. Pacific Command, which oversees all US military operations in the Indo-Pacific region. Previously he was deputy commander, U.S. Seventh Fleet. He brought a deep understanding of the ongoing issues in the Pacific, many of which have been in the news lately. Cadets to sea for Fleet Week:

Four Dealey Division Sea Cadets along with two Council board escorts drove to Norfolk on May 18th to report onboard USS Oak Hill (LSD 51). The 609 foot Landing Ship Dock is home to some 400 sailors and roughly an equal number of embarked Marines. The ship got underway the next morning for the transit to NYC Fleet Week arriving May 21st.

While onboard, the Cadets had hands-on briefings in operations, engineering, V-22 Osprey aircraft, LCAC hover craft, and Marine weapons and equipment. They stood part of a "midwatch" (after midnight) in the Combat Information Center (CIC) and on the bridge. Last night at sea was an unexpected USO show, presented on the ship's well deck.

The Cadets in their white uniforms had the honor of joining the ship's crew and Marines "manning the rails" coming up the Hudson, where a special salute was given while abreast the Ground Zero site.

The Cadets represented Dealey well, showing interest, enthusiasm, and discipline; a memorable trip and our Council thanks go to the men and women of the Oak Hill.
